I respectfully request and recommend that your Honorable Body approve of the following Amendments to Revised Ordinances entitled, "Compensation Plan and Leave Ordinances," Chapter 66, "Personnel".

CITY OF MEDFORD AMENDMENT TO REVISED ORDINANCES COMPENSATION PLAN AND LEAVE ORDINANCES CHAPTER 66, PERSONNEL

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Medford in Chapter 66 entitled "Personnel" Article II entitled "Classification and Compensation Plans" Section 66.40 entitled "Public Safety Personnel" is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. In subsection 66.40 – effective June 30, 2013 add one percent (1.0%) of the present amount of each step within the grade shown below, to the said present amount of each step and adjust the sum thus obtained to the nearest and highest figure for the following grade: PS-1 Patrol Officer.

Section 2. In subsection 66.40 effective January 14, 2014, add one percent (1.0%) of the present amount of each step within the grade shown below, to the said present amount of each step and adjust the sum thus obtained to the nearest and highest figure for the following grade: PS-1 Patrol Officer.

Section 3. In subsection 66.40 effective June 30, 2015, add two percent (2.0%) of the present amount of each step within the grade shown below, to the said present amount of each step and adjust the sum thus obtained to the nearest and highest figure for the following grade: PS-1 Patrol Officer.

Please be advised that under the provisions of M.G.L., Chapter 268A, Section 23 (b), I have a cousin who is a member of this association and will be affected by this award.

This amendment is requested due to a recently negotiated agreement with The Medford Police Patrolmen’s Association.
